Chas. G. Vahl Dies Early This Morning

Charles G. Vahl, widely known Brownstown resident, passed away about 7:20 o'clock this morning while enroute to the hospital at Seymour. He had become critically ill after midnight.

Funeral services will be conducted at the Zabel Funeral Home, Friday afternoon at two o'clock in charge of the Rev. George Clayman, pastor of the Brownstown Presbyterian church, of which Mr. Vahl was a member. Burial will be in Fairview cemetery.

Born November 22, 1893, in Brownstown township, he was the son of August Henry and Mary E. Benter Vahl, both deceased. He was married at Sauers November 7, 1915, to Martha VonDielingen, who survives.

Mr. Vahl has been in poor health for several years and had been seriously ill for about three months. Until his recent illness he had operated a grocery store in connection with the filling station of his son-in-law, Omer Terkhorn.

Other survivors besides the widow are two daughters, Mrs. Omer Terkhorn and Miss Mildred Vahl, at home; one brother, Albert, of Brownstown R1, one sister, Mrs. John Toenjes, of Seymour, and one half-brother, Henry Vahl, of Brownstown.
