DEATH RECORD.

Vanover—Mrs. Synthia Vanover, whose illness has been mentioned in these columns, passed away at her home in Brownstown Friday morning, December 16, 1921, of paralysis, aged 81 years, 11 months and 6 days. Her sickness dates back to June 13, 1913, when she was first stricken with paralysis. During all these years she bore her afflictions patiently. She was a woman of many excellent traits of character. She was a devoted wife and mother and a good neighbor. She united with the M. E. church in Vienna township, Scott county, in 1856, and after coming to Brownstown she united with the Baptist church, of which she was a member until death. Deceased was the daughter of Solomon and Rebecca Perrin, and was born in Vienna township, Scott county, Indiana, January 10, 1840. She was united in marriage to A. M. Vanover September 1, 1857. To their union were born ten children, nine girls and one boy, of whom three girls, Mrs. Edna Willhite, of Temperance, Mich.; Mrs. Nora Herrmann, of Indianapolis, and Mrs. Ida Wayman, of Brownstown, together with her husband survive her. She also leaves eleven grandchildren, ten great-grandchildren and two brothers, Andy and William Perrin, both of Brownstown. She moved to Brownstown with her family in 1878. Funeral services were conducted at the Baptist church Sunday afternoon at 2 o'clock, Rev. Leroy James, assisted by Rev. F. M. Moore, pastor of the Presbyterian church, officiating. Burial in Fairview cemetery.
