A. J. Vincent Is Taken By Death

Jonesville Merchant Victim Of Long Illness...Was Born In Brownstown.

Alvin J. Vincent, 62, prominent Jonesville railroader and merchant, died at 5 o'clock Monday afternoon at his home after a year's illness.

Funeral services will be held at 2 o'clock Thursday afternoon at Jones-ville Christian church. The body will be taken direct to Fairview cemetery, Brownstown, where short services will be conducted at the grave.

Mr. Vincent was a telegraph operator for the Pennsylvania railroad 35 years. He also operated a general store in Jonesville where he lived since 1906. He was a competent musician and formerly played with the Amcrican Legion band here.

Mr. Vincent was born December 16, 1878, at Ewing in Jackson county, the son of Jerous and Amanda Hawkins Vincent, but spent most of his life in Bartholomew county.

He married Miss Blanche Samples on Sept. 1, 1901, and ten children were born to them, two of them dying in infancy. Mrs. Vincent died Oct. 27, 1919. He was married the second time on October 26, 1921, to Mrs. Carrie Kempffer in Chicago. She survives.

Also surviving are a brother, Chas. D. Vincent of Ewing, a half-sister, Mrs. Mildred Knox of Minneapolis, and the following children: Mrs. Gus F. Welmer, this city; Mrs. Magdalene Lain, Canton, Ohio; Kenneth Vincent, South Bend; Keith and Forrest, Indianapolis; Roger E., Louisville; Mrs. Martin W. Steinwedel, Seymour, and Price H. Vincent, who will come from Camp Shelby for the funeral.
