## DEATH SUMMONS COMES TO MRS. H. W. WACKER

Was An Invalid Several Years---  
Ferris Robertson Died Saturday  
After Lingerin Illness

### OTHER DEATHS IN THE COUNTY

WACKER—Mrs. Fredericka Wacker, wife of Henry W. Wacker, Sr., deceased, passed away at her home in Brownstown Thursday morning, February 7, 1918, at 1:15 o'clock after an extended illness of several years.

Deceased was a daughter of Wm. and Charlotte Rust and was born in Germany January 1, 1841, making her age at the time of her death 77 years, 1 month and 6 days. She came to this country with her parents when she was about 12 years of age and settled in Jackson county. She was the last member of a large family to answer the summons.

She was united in marriage to Henry W. Wacker, at Louisville, November 4, 1860, who preceded her to the grave October 30, 1904. To their union were born five children, Mrs. Lillie Ireland, Mrs. Addie Mercer, Mrs. Mattie Robertson, Will H. Wacker, Cashier of the First National Bank, of this place, and Alex Wacker, who is employed at Bernice, La., who survive her. She also leaves five grandchildren and four great-grandchildren.

For a number of years the family lived at Shieldstown, where Mr. Wacker was engaged in business. In 1876, he was elected county treasurer and they moved to Brownstown where they have since resided.

Mrs. Wacker was a good mother, a kind and obliging neighbor and a good friend. During her long illness she never complained and all the care and love that her children could devise and apply for her comfort and assistance were brought into play and they were constantly at her bedside in her years of illness, during most of which time she was practically helpless.

The funeral services were conducted at the family residence Saturday morning at 10:30 o'clock by Rev. Otto Schumm, pastor of the Lutheran church, of which she was a member, after which the remains were laid to rest in Fairview cemetery.
