GEORGE W. WAGONER, 60, DIES AT BROWNSTOWN

Funeral Services Will be Con-
ducted Sunday Afternoon
at County Seat.

George Washington Wagoner, age sixty, died at his home in Brownstown at 7 o'clock Friday night. He had been in failing health for about a year and death was due to a complication of diseases.

Funeral services will be conducted at 3 o'clock Sunday afternoon, Daylight Saving Time, from the Brownstown Christian Church. Burial in Fairview Cemetery at Brownstown.

Mr. Wagoner was born on January 31, 1881, the son of Elisha and Martha Jane Moore Wagoner. He was married on April 2, 1916, to Luella Charles. They were the parents of seven children, five of whom survive.

Mr. Wagoner had been employed at the Brownstown plant of the Jackson Brick and Holloware Company for fourteen years and was well known throughout the Brownstown vicinity.

He is survived by the widow, and five daughters, Mrs. Catherine Matlock, of Brownstown; Mrs. Gladys Jones, of New Castle, Misses Pauline, Myrtle and Betty Lou Wagoner, all at home.
