Carl Edmond Wayman, 82, a retired Brownstown farmer, was killed in a tractor accident at 9 a.m. Thursday, July 28.

According to Jackson County Coroner Bill Bevers, Mr. Wayman was using a small tractor to mow grass along St. Rd. 135 at his residence. Bevers speculated that Mr. Wayman left the tractor to free a chain that had caught on a root. The tractor started rolling, and Mr. Wayman was caught under a wheel as he tried to get back on to stop it.

Cause of death was a crushed chest. The coroner said that death resulted immediately from the accident.

Funeral services will be conducted at 2 p.m. today, Saturday, from the Winkle-pleck-Weesner Funeral Home in Brownstown. The Rev. Charles Julian will officiate, and burial will be Fairview Cemetery.

A native and lifelong resident of Jackson County, Mr. Wayman was born Dec. 29, 1894, to the late Charles and Ida Vanover Wayman. On Nov. 8, 1916, at Seymour, he married the former Hazel Fountain, who survives.

Mr. Wayman was a member of the Brownstown Baptist Church and the Brownstown Senior Citizens Club.

Survivors in addition to the widow include three sons, Edmond, Robert C., and Joe N. Wayman, all of Brownstown Rt. 2; a brother, Paul Wayman, of Seymour; five grandchildren, and four great-grandchildren.
