IN MEMORIAM.

Browns town, Ind., Dec. 24, 1898.

The death of our late Comrade, Thos. B. Boyatt, being reported, a committee of three was appointed to report suitable expressions of the respect and fraternal love we bear to our dead Comrade.

Col. Thomas B. Boyatt was born near Clear Spring, in Jackson County, Ind., September 8, 1839, and died in Browns town, Ind., December 24th, 1898. He married Miss Sarah R. Beem, April 4, 1867, and left her and their three children, Chas. C. Ina and Lynn, surviving him.

In the death of Col. Boyatt our community has lost a valued, useful and good citizen, and our Post loses a faithful member, who has been associated with us for many years, and endeared himself to every member.

Col. Boyatt enlisted as a private in Co. B. 50th Reg. Ind. Vol. Inf. in September 1861 and was elected 2nd Lieut. of said Co. at the time the regiment was mustered into the service. He was promoted to 1st Lieut. May 20th, 1864, and to Captain October 20, 1864, and when the 50th and 52nd regiments were consolidated on May 19th, 1864, he was appointed Lieut. Colonel and was finally mustered out with his regiment in September 1865.

In all the relations of life, as citizen, neighbor, friend and comrade, both as civilian and soldier, he was ever faithful in his duty, and in his death we grievously feel our loss.

To his widow and children we extend our heartfelt sympathy in this the time of their deep affliction.

Be it ordered, that the furniture of this Post be draped in mourning for 30 days and that a copy of these proceedings be sent to the widow and children of our deceased Comrade and that the Browns town BANNER be requested to publish them.
