

DEATH RECORD.

BOYATT—W. L. Boyatt, who has been confined to the house on account of poor health for several years past, died at his home in Brownstown, Sunday, November 28, 1909, aged 65 years, seven months and five days.

William Lewis Boyatt was born in Owen township, Jackson county, Ind., April 23, 1844. He was raised on the farm and received the advantages of a good education, and taught school several terms.

In 1862 he enlisted in Company G, 54th Ind. Vols., serving four months, after which he enrolled in Company F, 145 Ind. Vols., and was commissioned first lieutenant and also served as adjutant.

He returned to Clearspring in 1866, where he engaged in the mercantile business and served as postmaster a few years. He came to Brownstown in 1882, where he resided until his death. Here he formed a partnership with his brother Thomas, now deceased, in the pension business, and they were recognized among the leading pension attorneys of this section.

In 1868 he was united in marriage to Lizzie Vawter, who died in 1871. In 1873 he was married to Mary E. Faubion, who also preceded him to the grave. He was married the third time to Alice Kenyon about twelve years ago, who is still living.

He is survived by seven children, viz: Two sons by his first wife—Mahlon of Indianapolis, and Everett, who is in the west; one son and four daughters by his second wife—Edwin, of Idaho; Mrs. Daisy Shutts, of Seymour; Mrs. Ida Robertson, Mrs. Anna Hamilton and Miss Lena Boyatt of this place.

Deceased was well known all over Jackson county and especially among the old soldiers. Before he was stricken with ill health he was one of the active and leading citizens of the county and had a large circle of friends and acquaintances.

The funeral services were held at the family residence Monday afternoon at 3 o'clock, Rev. Edw. F. Schneider officiating, after which the remains, were taken in charge by Brownstown Lodge No. 488, I. O. O. F., of which he was a member, and laid to rest in Fairview cemetery.
