

## 2 Aged County Residents Die

A long and useful life came to a peaceful close Monday afternoon at 1:30 o'clock when Mrs. Mary A. (Mollie) Brodhecker passed away at her home in Brownstown, age 80 years, 8 months and 2 days. She had been in failing health for about four months.

Mrs. Brodhecker was a lifelong resident of Jackson county.

She was born in Grassy Fork township January 1, 1861, the daughter of George and Catherine Schwein Doerr.
