A SAD ACCIDENT.

Avery Brown Killed by Falling from a Bicycle.

The shocking news reached here early Monday morning that little Ayery Brown, fourteen-year old son of Samuel Brown and wife of the West End, had been killed, near Campbellsburg, Washington county, Sunday, while riding a bicycle.

The particulars of the sad accident, so far as we are able to learn, are as follows: He had gone to Campbellsburg Saturday to visit relatives and on Sunday afternoon started to take a ride on his cousin's bicycle. In going down a steep hill, known as the Steyens hill in that vicinity, he lost control of the wheel and was dashed to the ground at the foot of the hill, crushing his skull, and badly bruising one side of his face and shoulder and probably sustaining internal injuries.

Some one in the vicinity saw the accident and ran to him; and on seeing that he was badly injured, asked his name, to which he managed to reply "Avery Brown" and that his home was at Brownstown, which were the last words he spoke. He was at once taken to his grandmother's residence, where he died at 10 o'clock Sunday night, the accident occurring at about 4 o'clock.

The remains were brought here Monday, arriving about noon, and the funeral services were held at the residence the same afternoon about 4 o'clock, Eld. G. M. Shutts officiating, after which interment took place in Fairview cemetery.

Avery was a bright and industrious boy and of kind disposition and well spoken of by those who knew him. He clerked at the Aetna hotel a few weeks, but devoted his time last week to blacking shoes during teachers' institute.

The parents have the heartfelt sympathy of our citizens in their deep affliction.
