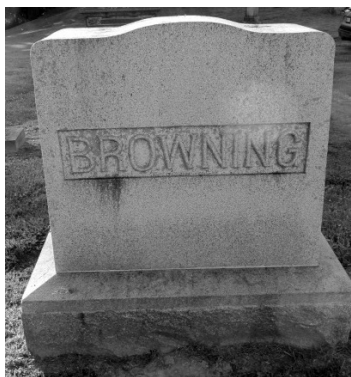
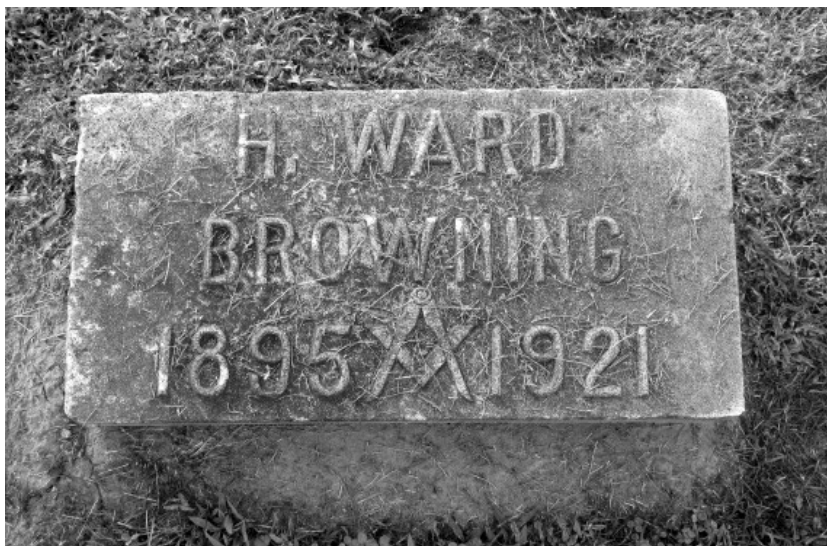

Ward Browning Prominent Young  
Farmer of That Vicinity, Ex-  
pires Early Today.

**WAS KICKED BY YOUNG MULE**

**Accident Occurs While Animal Which  
as not Accustomed to Har-  
ness Was Being Hitched up.**

Ward Browning, a prominent young Brownstown farmer, died at his home in that place at 1 o'clock this morning from injuries sustained when he was kicked by a mule. He was born and reared at Brownstown and was twenty-six years old. At first it was not believed that his injuries were serious but a change in his condition came several hours before his death.

The accident which cost Browning his life occurred Tuesday morning while he and Ralph Roehner, a young man employed by him, were hitching a young mule to a wagon. They intended to go to a field in the neighborhood to plow. The mule was not accustomed to harness and while it was being hitched to the wagon the animal kicked, both feet hitting Mr. Browning in the abdomen.

Young Browning was removed to his home. His injuries were not regarded as serious until Tuesday night when physicians who made an examination decided that an operation was necessary. Before this could be performed, however, Browning's condition became more serious and he died at 1 o'clock.

Besides the widow the deceased is survived by a small son, J. C. Browning, his mother, Mrs. Lucy Browning, and other relatives and many friends. Mr. Browning was a member of the Masonic and Knights of Pythias lodges at Brownstown. He was active in agricultural circles and was identified with many community movements.

The funeral will be held at Brownstown Friday afternoon at 2 o'clock under the auspices of the Masonic and Knights of Pythias lodges.
