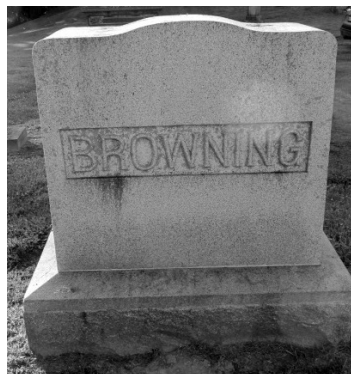

## Mrs. Browning, 77, Passes Away May 4

Funeral Services Held Sunday At Christian Church, Brownstown — Other Deaths.

Mrs. Lucinda Browning, age 77, passed away at her home in Brownstown Thursday night, May 4, at 8:30 o'clock. Death was attributed to heart trouble. Although she had been sick four weeks, her death came as a shock to her many friends.

Funeral services were conducted at the Christian church Sunday afternoon at 1:30 o'clock with the Rev. John U. Phelps, pastor, in charge. Burial in Fairview cemetery.

Mrs. Browning was born in Brownstown the daughter of William L. and Sarah Ann Wayman Ewing, pioneer residents of Jackson county, August 18, 1866, and spent her entire life in Brownstown. In 1885 she was married in Brownstown to Jacob Cross Browning, who preceded her in death a number of years ago.

Mrs. Browning was an active member of the Christian church and was always ready and anxious to perform any religious duty resolving itself upon her. For sixty-four years Mrs. Browning was a teacher in the Sunday school and for the past forty years she was the teacher of the Loyal Sons and Daughters class. She was a member of the Brownstown Study Club. She was a woman of excellent qualities and leaves a host of friends to mourn her death.

She is survived by one sister, Mrs. Iva Norton, of Norman, Oklahoma, and two grandchildren, J. C. Browning, of Chicago; Mrs. Betty Fisher, of Brownstown, and three great-grandchildren.
