BULTMAN-Mrs. Carrie Bultman wife of John H. Bultman, whose sick ness has been mentioned in these columns, died at her home, one mile south east of Brownstown Thursday night January 11, 1917, of cancer, aged 53 years, 4 months and 9 days.

She was a daughter of Mr. and Mrs Mathias Marqus t, deceased, and was born September 2, 1863.

Her entire life was spent in Brownstown township, where for 19 years she followed her profession of teaching school, and was conceded to be one of the best teachers in the township during that time

She was united in marriage to John H. Bultman, who to-day mourns the loss of his faithful companion. Besides her husband she leaves three sisters, Mrs. Adda Gossman and Mrs. Margaret Stotz, of Brownstown, and Mrs. Anna Griffin, of Tampico. Also a number of nieces and nephews and a host of tends besides the many pupils of former days, whose lives have been the better for her instruction and guidance in earlier years.

When a girl she united with the Prestyterian church at Brownstown from which she moved her letter to the Methodist church at Pleasant Grove during her residence in that community and was a faithful worker both in the Su day school and church, and was ever read, to do something for the upbuild, ing of His cause. She bore her suffering with Christian fortitude and her cheerful disposition lent brightness to her last days which were given over to praver and praise and a cheerful resignation to her Master's will.
