DEATH RECORD.

BURRELL.

Frank Burrell, who was sent to the insane asylum at Indianapolis several months ago, died at that institution Friday, April 13, 1900, aged 50 years, 5 months and 23 days. The remains arrived at Vallonia, Sunday night, and the funeral services were held at the home of his father-in-law, Thos. Craft, Monday, at 1 o'clock p. m., Rev. S. C. Bates, officiating, after which the remains were brought here and laid to rest in Fairview cemetery.

Frank Burrell was born October 22, 1849, and was a son of Capt. A. J. Burrell, an old settler of Driftwood township, but who died in Kansas about six years ago. In his younger days Frank clerked in his father's store at Vallonia, but entered upon a public career at the age of 22 years when he was elected trustee of Driftwood township, and owing to his excellent clerical abilities his services were in constant demand, and he served as deputy circuit clerk, deputy treasurer and deputy auditor. He was elected county clerk in 1878 and served two terms. After his term as county clerk expired, Mr. Burrell moved with his family to Kokomo where they resided until something more than a year ago, when he returned with his family to Vallonia.

The family has the heartfelt sympathy of a large circle of friends in their sad affliction.
