BURRELL—Reuben Burrell died at his home in Brownstown Thursday, December 7, 1911, aged 67 years, 2 months and 15 days. He had been in poor health for several years and was stricken with paralysis several months ago from which he never fully recovered. The funeral services were conducted at the family residence Saturday afternoon at two o'clock, Rev James Findley officiating, followed by interment in Fairview cemetery.

OBITUARY.

Reuben Burrell was the fourth child of John H. and Mary Findley Burrell, deceased, and was born September 22, 1844, on the home farm just north of Brownstown. He was married to Mary A. Sage July 13, 1864. To their union were born fourteen children, seven of whom with the wife survive him, viz: Will, George, Mrs. Minnie Browning and Forrest, of Brownstown; Mrs. Mary Lockhart, of Tennessee; Bartholomew, of Indianapolis and Mrs. Doyle Flynn, of Washington, Ind. He is also survived by two brothers and one sister, John B. and Mrs. Frank Branaman, of this place, and Hugh, of Oklahoma.

He served in the Civil war, being in Capt. B. E. Long's company. After the close of the war he spent his time in farming until the death of his father in 1894 when he moved to Brownstown into the home where he died. In late years he suffered a great deal from rheumatism and other diseases incident to army services.

He was not a member of any church, but he was not antagonistic to religion. He spent his last few days in prayer for peace and pardon and his last words were "Glory Hallelujah!" **
