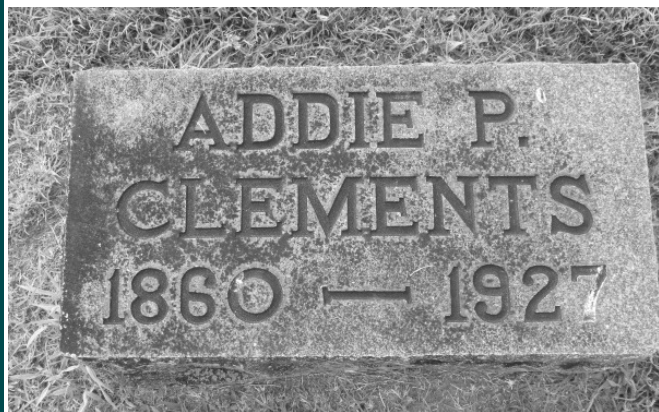

Clements—Brownstown as a community has received many sorrowful messages but none more sorrowful that the one received Saturday night when it was learned that Mrs. Addie Clements, wife of James S. Clements, of Brownstown, had passed away at the Bartholomew county hospital at 10 o'clock. Her death was due to sarcoma of the liver.

Mrs. Clements had been in failing health for several months, but was able to be up and about. Three weeks ago she was taken to her bed and a week ago Sunday was taken to the hospital, where she submitted to an operation on the following morning, when her condition was found to be such that no hope was held out for her recovery. Everything was done for her that could be done, but to no avail and she gradually grew weaker until she passed into that sleep that knoweth no awakening.

Mary Addie Phifer, youngest daughter of John and Sallie Jones Phifer, deceased, was born in Brownstown October 21, 1860. She attended the Brownstown schools, and after completing the same, she took up school teaching. She taught in the Brownstown schools for many years, and became generally recognized as one of its most efficient and successful teachers.

June 17, 1913, she was married to James S. Clements at Connersville, by the Rev. W. N. Fletcher, a former pastor of the Brownstown Methodist church. In early life she united with the Methodist church and took an active part in
