Services Set Wednesday For L. A. Wever

Lawrence A. Wever, 59, 450 Fairview Drive, Columbus, a former resident of Medora, died at 4:30 p. m. Sunday in Bartholomew County Hospital, Columbus, following an illness of seven months' duration. He was a retired millwright with Hamilton Cosco, Columbus.

Born Nov. 6, 1915, in Leesville, the son of the late A. E. and Anna V. Crawford Wever, he was married Dec. 10, 1938, in Medora, to Phyllis Eglen, who survives.

Mr. Wever, who served with the U. S. Navy 1944-45, was a member of Medora Lodge No. 328, F. & A. M., and Brownstown Chapter No. 264, Order of Eastern Star. He was also a member of Sandy Hook United Methodist Church, Columbus.

Survivors, in addition to the widow, include four children: Mrs. Patricia Osborn and Joseph Wever, of Indianapolis, and Gene Ellis Wever and Beth Ann Wever, at home. Also surviving are two brothers, William Wever, of Hillside, Ill., and Raymond Wever, of Arlington Heights, Ill., and three sisters, Mrs. Alta Mae Anderson, Bedford R3, Mrs. Ruth Carter, of Alexandria, Va., and Mrs. Helen Cain, of Columbus. Seven grandchildren also survive. One grandchild preceded Mr. Wever in death.
