## Mrs. Winklepleck Dies, Services Set Saturday

Mrs. Vernal Catherine Winklepleck, 78, of Brownstown, died at 2:30 p. m. Wednesday at the Lutheran Community Home. She had been in failing health for several months.

A resident of this county since 1918, she and her husband operated a funeral home in Freetown for many years and in June, 1944 moved the business to Brownstown. Mrs. Winklepleck retired in 1967.

She had attended State Normal at Terre Haute and taught in elementary schools at Plainville and Elmore.

Born March 12, 1897, in Plainville, she was the daughter of the late Frank J. and Myrtle Murphy Burroughs.

In April 1918 in Daviess County, she married Harry V. Winklepleck who died in October, 1945.

Surviving are three children, Mrs. Joyce Eskew, of Rushville, Mrs. James (Martha) Richter, of Sudbury, Mass., and Harry E.
