WITTENBERG—A long distance telephone message Wednesday night brought the sad news of the death of Mrs. Will Wittenberg, which occurred at her home at North Vernon from an attack of influenza followed by double pneumonia. Not many here knew of her illness and her death came as a shock to her many friends at this place.

Deceased was the eldest daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Peter Heller of this place. She was a woman of excellent qualities, loyal in friendship, a sympathizing neighbor and a devoted wife. She was of a sunny disposition and it can be said of her that she was a girl who always wore a smile.

Services were held at her late home in North Vernon Friday morning and the remains were brought here and taken direct to the Presbyterian church, where services were held by Rev. W. D. Cole, of Vernon, Friday afternoon at 1:30 o'clock, followed by burial in Fairview cemetery.

The following obituary was read at the funeral:

"Allie May Wittenberg nee Heller was the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Peter Heller and was born at Brownstown, Ind., September 7, 1883, where she spent the early years of her life.

She was united in marriage to Wm. Wittenberg March 11, 1902. They moved to North Vernon in 1906, where she has since resided until her death December 11, 1918, at the age of 35 years, 3 months and 4 days.

At twelve years of age she joined the Presbyterian church at Brownstown on confession of faith in Jesus Christ. After moving to North Vernon, she united with the Presbyterian church there, of which she has been a faithful member and an earnest worker.

She is survived by her husband, father, mother and one sister, Mrs. Willis Robbins, of Brownstown, and a host of neighbors and friends, who mourn the loss of one beloved by all who knew her."
