MRS. MARY WOODMANSEE DIED MONDAY AT MITCHELL

Widow of the Late William G. Woodmansee Passed Away at the Home of Her Daughter.

Mrs. Mary Woodmansee, formerly of Brownstown, widow of the late William G. Woodmansee, died Monday evening at 10:30 o'clock at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Harry Clements, at Mitchell, where she went several weeks ago for a visit. Mrs. Woodmansee had been in poor health for some time but her condition was not critical until a few days ago.

The deceased was sixty-six years of age, having been born in 1848 at Taylorsville. After her marriage she lived at Brownstown for a number of years and later moved to Indianapolis. She was the daughter of the late R. M. J. Cox, one of the prominent pioneers of Jackson county.

Mrs. Woodmansee is survived by two daughters, Mrs. Clements, of Mitchell, Mrs. Harry Crain, of Hutchins, Kans., and two sons, Abe Woodmansee, of Indianapolis, and Howard Woodmansee, of Shelbyville. She is also survived by five brothers and two sisters, among whom are Alpha Cox and Mrs. Charles L. Kessler, of this city.

The remains will be taken to Brownstown Wednesday morning and the funeral will be conducted at the Brownstown Baptist church at 1:30 o'clock by Rev. Mr. Elmore. Burial at the Brownstown cemetery.
