WOODMANSEE—William G. Woodmansee, formerly of this place, died at his home in Indianapolis, Wednesday, August 12, 1908, of tuberculosis, aged 58 years, 5 months and 10 days. The remains were brought here Friday morning and taken to the Baptist church, where the funeral services were held at 1 o'clock p. m., Rev. J. S. Washburn officiating after which they were laid to rest in Fairview cemetery in accordance with the ritualistic services of Washington Lodge, No. 13, F. & A. M.

William Graham Woodmansee, son of Asher and Francis Woodmansee, was born in Grassy Fork township, Jackson county, Indiana, March 2, 1850. For many years he lived on a farm just north of Brownstown and from there he moved to Brownstown, where he resided until 1903, when he moved with his family to Indianapolis. He was united in marriage to Mary Cox in 1872. To this union were born seven children, two of whom—Rose and an infant—preceded him to the grave. Two sons and three daughters, together with their mother, survive him, viz: Howard, of Cedar Lake, Ind.; Mrs. Harry Crane, of Tulsa, Okla.; Mrs. Harry Clements, of Mitchell, Ind.; and Abe and Celestus, who lived at home. He is also survived by one brother, Winfield, of North Dakota; and three sisters, Mrs. W. M. Rodman, of Brownstown; Mrs. Ben McCann, of Seymour; and Miss Ida Woodmansee, of Plainfield, Ind.

Deceased was a man who had many friends and but few if any enemies. He was a good citizen, honest and upright in his dealings; a kind neighbor and affectionate husband and father.
