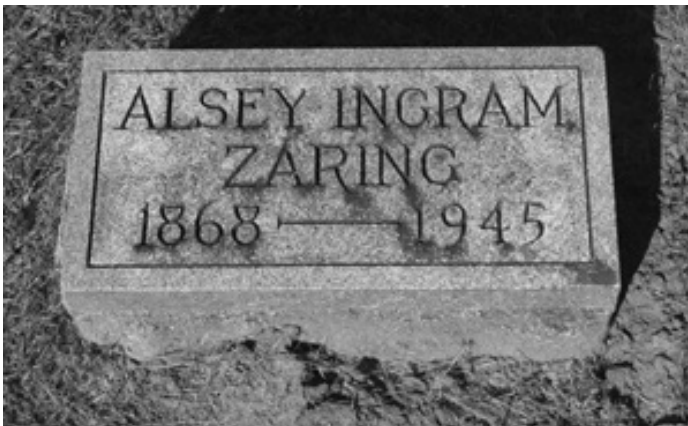

conducted Thursday afternoon at Brownstown.

Mrs. Zaring had been ill for the past nine years. She was a native of Uchee, Alabama, where she was born on July 5, 1868, the daughter of William L. and Margaret Kindred Ingram, both deceased. She was married on June 5, 1895, in Arkadelphia, Ark., to Philip A. Zaring, who died on May 18, 1925. They moved to Jackson county in 1895 and she had since resided here.

Mrs. Zaring held an A. B. degree from Ouachita College, Arkadelphia and she taught school for several terms prior to her marriage in 1895. Many friends throughout Jackson county mourn her death.

She is survived by four children: Wendell I. Zaring, of Austin; Roswald A. Zaring, of Seymour; Major Byron K. Zaring, stationed in San Francisco, Calif., with the U. S. Army and Mrs. Harold Morford, of Columbus. Another daughter, Mrs. McGee, died April 9. She also is survived by six grandchildren, including one in service in the Philippine Islands.

Funeral services will be conducted at 2 o'clock Sunday afternoon from the Voss Mortuary and at 2:30 o'clock from the Brownstown Presbyterian Church with the Rev. Walter Zannah, pastor, in charge. Burial in Fairview Cemetery, Brownstown.
