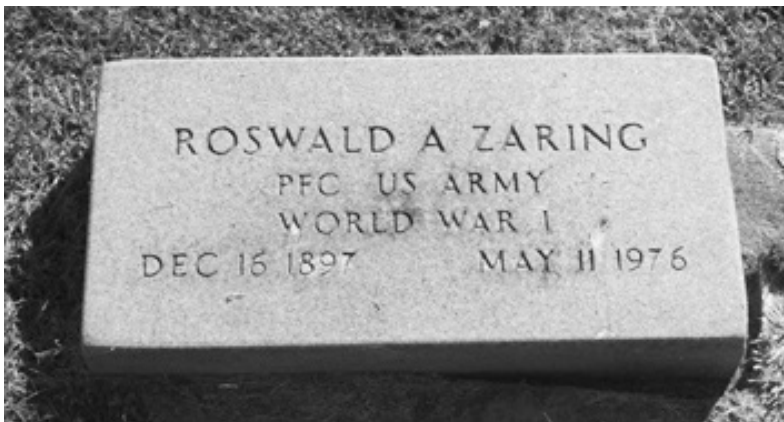

Roswald Zaring Dies, Rites Set Friday

Roswald A. Zaring, 78, 845 South O'Brien street, died at 8:40 p. m. Tuesday at Jackson County Schneck Memorial Hospital. He had been seriously ill for four days.

The first volunteer from Jackson County in World War I, he served with the Red Diamond Division of the Fifth Army.

He retired in 1957 after 40 years as a civil service employe, a railroad-mail clerk. He was a resident of this county most of his life.

He was a member of Barracks 480, World War I Veterans.

Born Dec. 16, 1897, in Tampico, he was the son of the late Dr. Phillip Alvin and Asley Ingram Zaring.

On June 11, 1927, in Tampico, he married Alice B. Bryan, who survives.

In addition to the widow, Mr. Zaring is survived by one son, Richard L. Zaring, Scipio R1; one brother, Dr. Byron K. Zaring, of Columbus; one sister, Mrs. Leonora Morford, of Indianapolis, and several nieces and nephews.

He was preceded in death by one son, John R. Zaring, who died in 1955, and by one brother and one sister.

The funeral will be conducted at 11 a. m. Friday from the Voss Chapel with the Rev. Don Kastner, pastor of the First Presbyterian Church, and the Rev. Ray Bush, of Columbus, officiating. Burial with military rites in Fairview Cemetery, Brownstown.
