Ackerman—Mrs. Nora E. Ackerman, wife of Dr. C. L. Ackerman, died at the family home in Brownstown Saturday morning, May 8, at 2 o'clock of organic heart disease, aged 55 years, 6 months and 12 days.

Mrs. Ackerman had been in failing health for the past fifteen years but was able to be up and about. She was taken worse about three weeks ago and gradually grew weaker until Saturday morning when she suddenly passed away.
