J. D. Allman, B'town RI, Killed—Rites Set

A well known 41-year-old Jackson County man was killed in a tragic accident Tuesday afternoon when he and another Jackson County man were cutting timber on the Everett Yancy farm seven miles northwest of Green-

castle. Mr. Allman died around 3:30 p. m., approximately 20 minutes after the accident, the coroner said.

J. D. "Mutt" Allman, 41, Brownstown RI, was attempting to dodge a falling limb when he slipped and fell and the timber fractured his skull.

Ivan Bane, Freetown RI, was working with Allman. He told Putnam County Coroner John Whitaker that he and Allman had

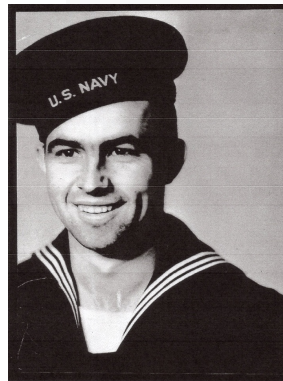
He was born in Jackson County on May 2, 1918, son of Mort and Dora Baker Allman. His father survives but his mother preceded him in death.
