


Reported Missing In Action

Feltner Baker, 25, son of Mr. and Mrs. B. F. Baker, of the Wegan neighborhood, is reported as missing in action since August 19, 1943.

Baker enlisted in the Navy July 28, 1942, and received his train-

ing at the Great Lakes Naval Training station. He was on duty on a destroyer on foreign duty.
