

## Mrs. Florence Banks, Expires on B'town R1

Mrs. Florence Banks, 85, widely known resident who had lived in Jackson county virtually all her life, died at 9 o'clock Tueşday night at her residence 10 miles northwest of Brownstown on Brownstown R1. Although she had been in failing health for the past year, her death occurred rather suddenly.

Funeral services will be conducted at 2 o'clock Thursday afternoon from the Winklepleck Funeral Home, Brownstown. Burial in Fairview Cemetery, Brownstown.

Mrs. Banks was born November 3, 1869, at Spraytown, the daughter of the late Emanuel and Malinda C. Martin Beavers. She was married December 29, 1891, in Jackson county to Jesse Banks, who survives. She had lived for the past 60 years in the home in which she died and was a member of the Methodist Church. She was widely known, particularly in the vicinity west of Ratcliff Grove where she had lived for so many years, and a host of friends mourns her death.

Besides the husband, she is survived by three nephews whom Mr. and Mrs. Banks reared as sons: Ralph Wineinger, Brownstown R1; Meredith and Kenneth Wineinger, both of Seymour; one brother, John Beavers, residing west of Brownstown on Freetown R1 and one sister, Mrs. Ollie B. Stockwell, residing with Mr. and Mrs. Banks on Brownstown R1. One brother and two sisters preceded her in death.
