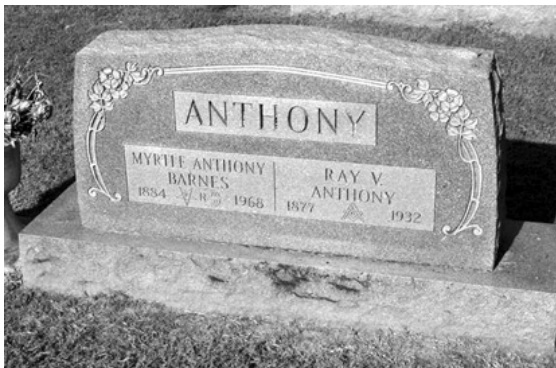

Mrs. Myrtle Barnes, 84, Dies After Long Illness

Mrs. Myrtle Barnes, 84, widow of Sylvester Barnes, died Saturday at her home, 1204 Lafayette avenue, following a 3-year illness.
