Almond "Al" Beavers, Ex-Orchardman, Dies

Almond "Al" Beavers, 81, Brownstown R1, well known former operator of extensive fruit orchards for a number of years west of Ratcliff Grove on the Clearspring ridge in western Jackson county, died at 3:45 o'clock. Tuesday afternoon at Schneck Memorial Hospital where he was admitted last Thursday for medical treatment. Mr. Beavers had been in failing health for several years and his condition had been worse since, the death of his wife January 20, 1952.

Funeral services will be conducted at 1.80 o'clock Thursday afternoon from the Winklepleck Funeral Home at Brownstown with the Rev. Charles W. Fisher, Christian minister at Norman, in charge, Burial in Fairview Cemetery, Brownstown.

Mr. Beavers was born August 30, 1872, near Spraytown, the son of the late Emanuel and Malinda Martin Beavers.
