Mrs. Ruby Bell Dies After Long Illness— Burial Rites Here

Burial rites were held Sunday afternoon in Fairview Cemetery, here, for Mrs. Ruby Bell, of Seymour, following funeral rites at the Voss Chapel, Seymour, in charge of the Rev. William Bateman, pastor of the Brownstown Baptist Church.

Mrs. Bell died at 5:10 o'clock Thursday afternoon in Bartholomew County Hospital, Columbus, where she had been a patient two weeks. Her condition was serious when admitted and had been critical for several days prior to her death.

She had been ill for almost a year and had been a patient previously in the hospital at Columbus and also at Robert Long Hospital, Indianapolis.

Born in Brownstown, November 11, 1910, she was a daughter of Mrs. Ida Mae Fordice McCrary, of Brownstown, and the late William McCrary. She attended Brownstown High School and business college in Seymour.

At the time of her illness she was bookkeeper at the G. B. Davis Coal & Building Material firm in Seymour and prior to that had been bookkeeper for the J. A. Hoadley Company, predecessor of the Davis firm.

On December 29, 1935, she was married, at Jeffersonville, to Glenn A. Bell, who died on November 9, 1957.

She was a member of the Brownstown Baptist Church.

Her friendly disposition won her

many warm friends and her courage and optimism during her last illness was an inspiration to everyone who knew her.

Surviving, in addition to the mother, are a son, Stephen D. Bell, of Seymour; two brothers, William McCrary, of Springfield, Mass., and Irvin McCrary, of Brownstown; four sisters, Mrs. Rea Gray and Mrs. John Cockrum, of Brownstown, Mrs. Gordon Creager, of Seymour, and Mrs. Travis Jamison, of Vallonia, and the mother-in-law, Mrs. Jess Bell, of Seymour.
