Benton—Mrs. Carrie Benton, wife of Charles T. Benton, whose illness has been mentioned in these columns, passed away at her late home in Brownstown Friday morning, December 23, at six o'clock, of Bright's disease. Although she had been in failing health for a number of years, she had only been bedfast for about three weeks.

Funeral services were held at the Methodist church Sunday afternoon at 1:30 o'clock, Rev. T. Garland Smith officiating. Burial in Fairview cemetery.

Carrie Frysinger, eldest daughter of William and Laura Frysinger, deceased, was born in Lewistown, Pennsylvania, August 23, 1860, and died at her home in Brownstown Friday morning, December 23, 1921, aged 61 years and 4 days. She came to Brownstown with her parents at the age of one year and six months, where she spent the remainder of her life. She was united in marriage to Charles T. Benton, December 14, 1881. To this union were born one daughter, Mrs. Pearl Greger, of Brownstown, and one son, Clyde F. Benton, of Whittier, California.

In early life she united with the Brownstown Methodist church, and before her health failed she was ever ready and anxious to perform any religious duty resolving itself upon her. To her duty was first, whether to her church, her family or her friends. She was a charter member of the Pythian Sisters and Eastern Star lodges. Her whole life was centered in her family, who will sadly miss the tender devotion of a wife and mother.
