

Burial Rites For Mrs. Charles Bolles Held Here Today

Graveside services were conducted at Fairview cemetery this afternoon for Mrs. Mabel Bolles, of Indianapolis, a former Brownsburg town resident. Officiating was the Rev. Edsel Granger, pastor of the Presbyterian church. Funeral services were held at the Feeney and Feeney Mortuary, Indianapolis, this morning.

Mrs. Bolles suffered a stroke on Saturday from which she did not regain consciousness and another Sunday afternoon about five o'clock claimed her life. She had been an invalid for the past two years suffering from Parkinson's disease.

Born in Brownstown March 11, the deceased was the daughter of Henry and Hettie Cummings Scott. She was married in Brownstown in January of 1900 to Charles Bolles, who survives. Other survivors include two sons, Robert Bolles, of Indianapolis, and Richard, of Port Arthur, Texas; two sisters, Mrs. Lorraine Osborne, Indianapolis, and Mrs. Florence McKee, Houston, Texas; and eleven grandchildren.

Mrs. Bolles was a resident of Brownstown until about 1940 when she and Mr. Bolles moved to Indianapolis to care for her mother. She was a member of the Brownsburg Presbyterian church but after moving to Indianapolis she and Mr. Bolles affiliated with the North Central Methodist church.

Mrs. Bolles possessed a pleasant and kindly disposition and was loved by all who knew her.
