Samuel Arthur Braden, age seventy-nine, a resident of Jackson county for sixty-eight years, died at his home two miles south of Freetown at 1 o'clock Monday afternoon following an illness of one year.

Mr. Braden, a prominent farmer of the Freetown vicinity many years, was a native of Ohio, hav-

ing been born in Washington county December 26, 1852, the son of John and Eleanor Braden. He moved to Jackson county from Ohio in 1864 and has resided near Freetown since that time.

He was married November 6, 1881, at Freetown, to Miss Laura Tinch, who survives. He was a prominent member of the Freetown Methodist Church.

Besides the widow, he is survived by seven daughters, Mrs. Tessie Denny, of Kurtz; Mrs. Bernice Johnson, of Indianapolis; Mrs. Elsie Ramp, near Ewing; Mrs. Alice Noe, Freetown; Mrs. Clarice Stilwell, near Freetown; Mrs. Mabel Schornick, Freetown, and Mrs. Edith Spurgeon, Ewing; and one son, Charles Braden, of Columbus. Two sisters, Mrs. Ella Mann and Mrs. Agnes Forgye, both of Freetown, ten grandchildren and three great-grandchildren also survive.
