

Jackson County Judge Dies at 65

John C. Branaman Is Heart Attack Victim

Special to The Indianapolis News BROWNSTOWN, Ind., Dec. 15—John C. Branaman, 65, judge of the Jackson county circuit court and former member of the Indiana legislature, died of a heart attack in his sleep at his home here early today.

A Democrat, he was elected judge of the Lawrence and Jackson circuit court in 1930 and when the county was separated in 1942 he was elected judge of Jackson county. He served as representative from Jackson and Brown counties in the assembly sessions of 1911, 1913 and 1915.

Judge Branaman was a Spanish-American war veteran, serving as first lieutenant with Company G. 159th regiment, Indiana volunteers. He attended Indiana University. leaving school before graduation to join his regiment. After the war he took up the study of law with his father. Frank Branaman and became widely-known in judicial circles in the state. He was a member of the Brownstown Presbyterian church, the Knights of Pythias and the Elk's Lodge at Seymour.

Surviving are the widow and two daughters. Miss Jacqueline Branaman, attending Barnard College in New York city, and Miss Patricia Ann Branaman, a junior at Indiana University.
