## Saturday-former news editor

Rolland Andrew Brodheck-er, 86, Lake and Forest Club, Brownstown, died Wednesday in Newton, N.J.

He was Brownstown Ban-ner editor-in-chief, 1930-1965; a reporter for the Kokomo Dispatch, 1928-1930; and a Jackson Federal Savings and Loan Association director, 1941-1970, and president, 1961-1970. He served on Brownstown
