Browning—Mrs. Emma Browning, wife of Frank Browning, passed away at her home in Brownstown Sunday morning, January 8, 1922, after a long illness of cancer, aged 67 years, 8 months and 14 days.

Mrs. Browning was the youngest daughter of George W. and Phoebe Cummins and was born on what is known as the John Cummins farm east of Brownstown, April 24, 1854. She came to Brownstown when a small child and has practically spent her entire life here. She was united in marriage to Frank Browning October 15, 1878. To their union were born four children. One son, Frank, preceded her to the grave April 29, 1914.
