Funeral Rites Held For John R. Browning

Funeral services for John R. Browning, age seventy-three, well known Jackson county farmer who died Saturday morning at his home in the Pleasant Grove neighborhood, on a Brownstown rural route, were conducted this afternoon from the Pleasant Grove Methodist Church, with the Rev. William DeHart in charge. Burial was in Fairview Cemetery, Brownstown.

Mr. Browning had been ill for the past three years, and for three months preceding his death had been bedfast.

A life-long resident of Jackson county, he was born on December 27, 1870, near Kurtz, in Owen township, the son of William and Nancy Guthrie Browning, both of whom preceded him in death. Through his long residence in this county he had made a host of friends who join with relatives in mourning his death.

The widow, the former Elizabeth Thompson, to whom Mr. Browning was married in this county on February 11, 1890, survives, as do nine children, one sister, three brothers, and seventeen grandchildren.

Children surviving Mr. Browning are Mrs. Ora Hunsucker and Ralph Browning, both of the Pleasant Grove neighborhood on a Ewing rural route; Charles Browning, of Bedford; William Browning, residing on a Cortland rural route; Leonard Browning, residing east of Acme; Mrs. Raymond Dailey, of Indianapolis; Otis Browning, on a Ewing rural route; Mrs. Rolland Jolley, on a Cortland rural route; and Mrs. Luther Conner, on a Columbus rural route.

Mrs. Bessie Richardson, the sister, lives in this city, as does a brother, Lute R. Browning. Another brother, Ernest Browning, resides in Indianapolis, and a third, T. J. Browning, lives on a Ewing rural route.
