Emmett Burrell Dies— Native Of Brownstown— Rites Held Monday

Funeral rites were held Monday afternoon from the Voss Chapel, Seymour, for Emmett Burrell, 59, a native of Brownstown and for 21 years an employee of the Thompson Dairy Company in Seymour.

Mr. Burrell died early Saturday morning at the Jackson County Hospital, eight hours after being admitted after he became suddenly ill late Friday evening.

A son of the late George and Elizabeth Schull Burrell, he was born in Brownstown on August 23, 1902, and had spent all of his life in Jackson county. Long active in Democratic politics, Mr. Burrell has served for many years as a precinct committeeman in 11th precinct in Sevmour.

He was a member of Trinity Methodist Church, Seymour. He was married, in Brownstown, on July 2, 1926, to Edith Knott, who survives.

Also surviving are two sons Patrick Burrell, of Greenwood, and Kenneth R. Burrell, Seymour, and a sister, Mrs. Forest Shelton, of Brownstown.

Two grandchildren, Marie and Linda Burrell, of Greenwood, also survive.

The Rev. Richard G. Gates, Trinity Methodist pastor, was in charge of funeral rites and burial followed in Fairview Cemetery here.
