OF Mrs. O. B. Burrell, whose death was briefly mentioned in these columns last week.

Mrs. Lula Burrell, nee Brodhecker, was born in Brownstown, June 25, 1865; died September 2, 1903, (which was also the date of her ninth wedding anniversary) aged 38 years, 2 months and 7 days. She was united in marriage to Oliver B. Burrell, September 2, 1894, to which union were born two sons, both dying in infancy, the oldest only living about ten months. Her father and two half sisters have preceded her to the grave. There survives her a husband, mother, one brother, one sister and one half sister in the immediate family, besides two half brothers and two half sisters. While not a member of any church, she affiliated more or less during her life with the Presbyterian church, being baptized in the same in infancy, a regular attendant at Sunday School in her childhood, and was also a member of the church choir at different times. Her kindness of heart and generous and cheerful disposition made her many warm and true friends. As a daughter she was ever obedient and submissive; as a wife she was affectionate, dutiful and always true to her marriage vows, and what few short months her home was cheered by the presence of a little son, a fonder nor more affectionate mother ever lived; as a sister, we shall ever cherish her memory dear, and as a neighbor she was held in the highest esteem. Her life was like an open book; she always endeavored to offend none, but to the contrary, was ever thoughtful and considerate of the welfare of others, and her presence will not only be missed in the family but in the community as well. The numerous beautiful floral offerings by friends were testimony of the esteem and respect in which she was held.

The funeral services were held at the residence Friday morning, September 4th, at 10 o'clock, Rev. C. C. Bonnell officiating, after which the remains were laid to rest in Fairview cemetery.
