Cribb—Miss Ella Cribb, age 81, passed away at the home of her nephew, C. Max Cribb, with whom she made her home, Wednesday night, June 1, at 7:30 o'clock. She had been sick for some time and for about nine months she had been bedfast. Death was due to a complication of diseases.

Miss Cribb, the daughter of Dr. Henry Sherman and Priscilla Cribb was born at Greenville, Floyd county, near New Albany, March 23, 1851. Dr. Cribb was a pioneer minister of the Christian church and preached and practiced medicine over sections of Southern Indiana at the same time. While a small girl she moved to Salem with her parents where she resided for some time. She had been a resident of Brownstown for sixty years. In her early life she united with the Christian church and was ever a faithful member.

Deceased was a most loveable woman, always having a cheery word and

a smile for everyone. She had been a patient sufferer, and although weak, she enjoyed the visits of her friends. She received every care and attention by her nephew and wife, who did all that could be done to relieve her of her suffering.
