

Coroner's Verdict. The undersigned, a Justice of the Peaceof Jackson county, Indiana, was notified that the dead body of Charles W. Doerr, was found about one-fourth of a mile from Brownstown, on the road . leading from Brownstown to Dudleytown, opposite the McCormick school house. I was requested to proceed at once, and hold an inquest upon the body of the said Charles W. Doerr, and the Corouer not being notified on account of the distance to his residence, and the body being in such condition as to require immediate attention, I at once proceeded to make the neccessary examination, after carefolly examining the body and hearing the evidence, I find that the said Charles W. Doerr, came to his death by violence at the hands of some person, or persons, unknown at this time, and the cause of his death was due to three mortal wounds upon the head, his skull being crushed in, either of which wounds would have caused his ieath. The instrument used to perpetrate the deed is supposed to be a hickory club, three fect and five inches in length, one and three-fourths inches n diameter, which was found near the dead body, with blood stains upon it.
