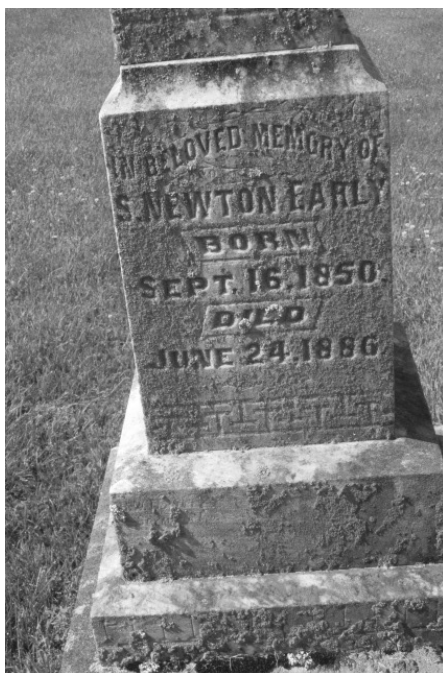

### Death of Newt. Early.

Sylvester Newton Early died at the residence of his father-in-law, Frank Emerson, in this place, on Thursday morning last, at 7:30 o'clock, of consumption. He began declining in health about 18 months ago, and day by day became weaker in body until death finally claimed him. He was a son of Samuel S. Early, deceased, and served efficiently as Deputy Sheriff under his father from 1878 to 1882. He was a native of Carr Township, and nearly all of his life-time was passed in this county. He was united in marriage to Miss Virginia Emerson on the 22d day of November, 1880. His wife and one child—a bright little boy—survive him, as also one sister, Mrs. Andrew J. Hamilton, of this place, and two brothers, Vincent L. and Frank. He was born September 16th, 1850, and at the time of his death was aged 35 years, 9 months and 8 days. When in health, Newt. Early was frank and outspoken, and while he had his faults, yet he had a warm heart within him, and the generous impulses of his nature won for him many friends.

The obsequies took place on Friday afternoon, with Brownstown Lodge, No. 60, K. of P., in charge of the remains. Religious services were conducted at the M. E. Church by Rev. George Cochran, assisted by Rev. W. W. Reynolds, after which the body was consigned to rest in the new cemetery with the solemn rites of the Order of Knight of Pythias.
