

## Death of John Findley.

It is with sorrow we record the death of John Findley, which occurred at his residence two miles above Brownstown on Monday evening, April 18th, at 6 o'clock. About two months ago Mr. Findley fell upon the ice, and sustained severe injuries upon his head, from which he suffered considerably. He had, however, so far recovered as to be about again, and two weeks ago last Saturday came to town to do some trading. A day or two later he was stricken with sickness, which culminated in inflammation of the brain and finally resulted in death.

John Findley was the oldest son of Hugh A. and Rebecca Findley, both deceased. He was born in Jackson county, and has resided here throughout life, with the exception of a few years spent in Iowa and Illinois. He was an industrious, honest, moral and upright man, and commanded the esteem of all who knew him. He had reached the age of 58 years, 6 months and 13 days. He leaves a wife and seven children-three boys and four girls. The obsequies were conducted on Wednesday morning at the family residence, where an appropriate discourse was preached by Rev. V. W. Tevis, after which the remains were brought to town and deposited in the new cemetery. Mr. Findley removed to this side of the river upon the old home farm only a few weeks before he took his last illness, previous to which time he had resided in Hamilton township.
