DEATH RECORD

Fislar—Mrs. Anna Fislar, whose illness has been mentioned, passed away at the home of her step-mother, Mrs. Margaret Loudon, Monday morning, January 26, following an extended illness of Brights disease.

Mrs. Fislar was the daughter of Jacob and Mary Ann Loudon and was born near Clearspring January 12, 1868. When a small child she moved to Brownstown with her parents, where she resided until January 13, 1889, when she was married to Edward Fislar, and moved to a farm south of town. To their union were born one son and one daughter. Her husband preceded her in death June 2, 1898. After the death of her husband she and her daughter, Miss Grace, moved to Vallonia where they resided until January, 1924, when they moved to Indianapolis. She had been in failing health for a long time and for several years was almost blind. In November she came to the home of her step-mother, who was as near and dear to her as an own mother, where nothing was left undone to relieve her of her suffering. During all her affliction she was patient and kind to all. She was a good mother and a kind, obliging friend and was held in high esteem by a large circle of friends in Vallonia and Brownstown.

She is survived by her son, Ralph, and her daughter, Miss Grace, both of Indianapolis. Also her step-mother, Mrs. Loudon; one brother, Robert Loudon, of Indianapolis, one sister, Mrs. Mollie Groover, of Elwood; two half brothers and three half-sisters, Guy Loudon, of Brownstown; Walter Loudon, Mrs. May Stout, Mrs. Kate Graham, of Indianapolis, and Mrs. Maude Lane, of South Carolina.

Funeral services were conducted at the Christian church at Vallonia, of

which she was a member, this afternoon at 1:30 o'clock, Rev. C. V. Weddle officiating. Burial in Fairview cemetery, Brownstown.
