FORD—Mrs. Lucy Ford, whose serious illness we mentioned last week, died Friday, August 17, 1900, aged 76 years 8 months and 27 days. She had been in declining health for several years past but the immediate cause of her death was paralysis. The funeral services were conducted at her late residence Sunday, August 19, 1900, at 9 o'clock a.m., Rev. E. L. Sanders officiating, after which the remains were laid to rest by the side of her husband, who preceded her to the grave, June 27, 1890.

Aunt Lucy, as she was fami liarly known, was of a rather retired disposition but was a good woman and a kind neighbor. She had a kind and unselfish disposition which made her many friends. She united with the Prebyterian church when quite young and ever lived a true christian life.

Lucy R. Philips was born in Springfield, Washington county, Ky., November 20, 1823, and was united in marriage to Ewell S. Ford, August 20, 1846. For 22 years she was matron of the county asylum of which her husband was superintendent. Since her husband's death she resided alone in the house where she died, until about fifteen months ago when her condition -both mentally and physically-became such that it was found necessary to have a guardian appointed for her, who arranged for someone to stay with her most of the time. With the exception of one brother, Wm. Phillips, of Harrodsbur g, Ky,, she is the last member of a large family.
