Coroner Terms Death Suicide

Dr. L. E. Shaver, Jackson county coroner, today attributed the death of Mrs. Edith Franklin, 47, at her Brownstown home to self-inflicted poisoning, and gave dependency over ill health as the probable motive.

Mrs. Franklin died Thursday afternoon. She had been in ill health for over a year.

Funeral services will be conducted at 2 o'clock Saturday afternoon from the Zabel Funeral Home at Brownstown, with the Rev. K. F. Johnson, pastor of the Church of the Nazarene, in charge. Burial in Fairview Cemetery at Brownstown.

Friends may call at the home in Brownstown at any time.

Mrs. Franklin was born June 30, 1899 in Jackson county, the daughter of Samuel and Iva Dierker Louder. She was married in 1922 to Lawrence Franklin, who survives. She was a member of the Brownstown Church of the Nazarene.
