

## Mother of Mrs. W. L. Johnson Passes Away After Few Days' Illness With Pneumonia.

Mrs. Laura Frysinger, aged seventy-seven years, a former resident of Brownstown, died Friday night at the home of her son-in-law, Nelson Apgar, in Indianapolis. following a few days' illness with pneumonia. Mrs. Frysinger was the mother of Mrs. W. L. Johnson, North Ewing street, and was the widow of the late William Frysinger, for many years editor of the Brownstown Banner and prominent in Jackson county public life.

The deceased was born in Lewistown, Pa., but lived in this county from early girlhood. She was a devoted member of the Methodist Episcopal church and was a earnest, christian woman. She moved to Indianapolis about ten years ago to make her home with her daughter, Mrs. Apgar, whose death occurred about a year ago. She had been in failing health for some time and her last illness was only of few hours duration.

Mrs. Frysinger is survived by two daughters, Mrs. Johnson, and Mrs. Charles T. Benton, of Brownstown, several grandchildren and greatgrandchildren. The body will be shipped here Monday morning and the funeral will take place at Brownstown Monday afternoon. Burial at Fairview cemetery at Brownstown.
