### Mrs. Beatrice Hancock, Mother Local Men, Dies At Salem—Rites Here

Funeral rites were held this afternoon from the Zabel Funeral Home for 58-year-old Mrs. Beatrice Hancock, who died early Monday morning at the home of a sister, Mrs. Flora Miller, 307 Tucker street, Salem, with whom she lived.

Mrs. Hancock was the mother of Ralph Rochner, Jr., and George Rochner, of Brownstown.

Her death was sudden, following a heart attack, although she had been in failing health for some time.

A native of Salem, she was born December 6, 1906, a daughter of the late George and Bedia Branaman Dobbins.

She was twice married. Her first marriage was to Ralph Rochner, and during that time she made her home in Brownstown. Following his death she was married to F. Doren Hancock, who died in 1958.
