

Adam Heller Expires After Long Illness

Aged 78 Years—Was Formerly Treasurer Of Jackson Co. —Other Deaths.

Adam Heller, aged 78, one of Jackson county's best known citizens, passed away at the Schneck Memorial hospital, Seymour, Saturday night at 8 o'clock. About two and a half years ago he suffered a stroke of paralysis which affected his left side, and was taken to the home of his brother, Peter Heller, in Brownstown. A year ago last June he was taken worse and was taken to the hospital, where he remained until his death.

Mr. Heller was one of a family of eleven children born to Adam and Wilhelmina Schwein Heller. He was born on the Heller homestead, about two and a half miles east of Brownstown, on what is now part of the Jackson County State Foresty, November 4, 1854.

For a number of years he taught school and later entered the mercantile business in Brownstown and for several years was proprietor of the Bee Hive which was located on the lot where the Banner office now stands. After disposing of his business he served as deputy county treasurer for eighteen years. He served two terms as county treasurer from 1905 to 1909.

He was known for his rugged honesty and square dealing. He was true to every trust and the old saying, "his word was as good as his bond," was applicable in its strictest sense to him. He was never known to betray a trust and has set a high mark for honesty and integrity for others to fellow. In politics he was a staunch Democrat. In early life he became a member of the Presbyterian church and was a frithful attendant as long as his health permitted.
