HELLER—Our citizens were greatly shocked last Friday morning when a message was received from Seymour stating that Miss Helena Heller, of this place, had died that morning at the Schneck Memorial Hospital, where she had undergone a surgical operation just a week before.

She had been reported as getting along as well as could be expected, and when her sisters returned home Monday they had hopes that she would soon recover. However, it seems that her change for the worse came so sudden that the attendants had no time to telephone here that Helena's condition had taken a critical turn and consequently it was quite a shock to her brother and sisters when the word came that she had passed away.

Those in charge of the hospital were positive that her death was not due to the operation, but from some cause which had not been revealed in previous diagnosis of her case. She had been in poor health for some time and had suffered considerably. About twelve years ago she was injured in a runaway accident, and had never fully recovered from the injuries she sustained at that time.

Deceased was the youngest daughter of William and Christina Schwein Heller. She was born December 25, 1878, at the old home place east of Brownstown. She lost her mother in infancy. The family moved to Brownstown in 1904 and the father was called to his reward in 1905.

She was a kind, loving and conscientious young lady, who by her gentle, amiable and pleasant disposition made for herself many friends, who will love and cherish her memory for all time to come. She is survived by three sisters and one brother, Misses Nancy and Tena, with whom she made her home; Mrs. Emma Rebber, of near Crothersville, and Geo. W. Heller, of this place, and to them, in their deep affliction the sympathy of many friends goes out.

The funeral services were conducted at the Presbyterian church Sunday afternoon at 1:30 o'clock Rev. L. V. Rule officiating, after which the remains were laid to rest in Fairview cemetery.
